

EAN Stroke Management Group Meeting 18th June 2018

1) Proposals for EAN Oslo 2019

The process for this was outlined. Proposals can be entered under a number of categories and the appropriate form needs filling in for each category. The Stroke Management Group will review proposals and rank them and send them onto the EAN Programme Committee. We agreed that any proposals should be sent to Lucia and copied into Nathan and Hugh by the 1st July.

It was agreed with Valeria Caso that there should be a joint EAN/ESO session at ESOC. One idea suggested by Georgios Tsivgoulis was a session on cerebral microbleeds and this was met with broad support. Georgios will send a proposal to Nathan and Hugh. Other proposals are welcome but they have to be received rapidly as the deadline is imminent. Valeria did agree that the deadline could be kept open for a couple of additional days.

2) Web Representatives for Stroke Management Group

The need for there to be a stroke presence on the EAN web was discussed. Simon Fandler and Kristin Kraglund kindly agreed to coordinate this on behalf of the Stroke Management Group.

3) Interaction with Other Specialty Areas in Writing Guidelines

The relationship with ESO in writing guidelines was discussed. This is being coordinated at a senior level between the EAN and ESO. The possibility of joint guidelines with other groups was discussed and this remains a possibility.

4) Teaching Courses and ESO

The relationship between ESO and EAN teaching courses in stroke had been discussed the previous day at a meeting between ESO and EAN. Proposals will be produced for this but it is expected that these will be primarily coordinated by ESO for teaching courses by ESO in collaboration with EAN.

5) Michelangelo Proposal Monogenic Stroke and Genetics

Michelangelo Mancuso proposed a position paper on diagnosis and testing from monogenic stroke. This was supported and he will develop a proposal.
